BREAKING NEWS: BMS-986094 DISCONTINUED

Bristol-Myers Squibb has decided to permanently halt development of BMS-986094 after a patient participating in a clinical trial with that drug passed away from heart failure. The death prompted Bristol-Myers originally to put the trial on hold voluntarily on August 1st, and the US FDA put a clinical hold on the drug soon after. In total, 9 patients were hospitalized. Two remain in the hospital. Both heart and kidney problems were cited. The cause of the drug's toxic effects is not yet known but is being investigated. Other drugs from different companies have had to discontinue products because of heart problems. The company has another drug showing promise—daclatasvir, now in phase III clinical trials, the last step before the drug is submitted for approval from the regulators. BMS-986094 was previously called INX-189 which BMS acquired when it bought Inhibitex earlier this year for \$2.5 billion.

HEMOPURIFIER

Aethlon's Hemopurifier is a device that can rid the blood of viruses like HIV and HCV. Treatment data from trials in India showed that the two most recent HCV+ patients treated with Hemopurifier therapy combined with pegIFN/RBV (PR) had undetectable viral load at day 7. The best predictor of SVR (sustained viral response--undetectable virus 24 weeks after treatment) is RVR (rapid viral response--undetectable virus 30 days after starting therapy.) The famous IDEAL Study (3,070 HCV genotype-1 patients) showed only 10.35% of PR-treated patients achieved RVR, but of those patients, 86.2% achieved SVR. The IDEAL study showed only 4.3% of patients achieved undetectable status at day 14, but of those, 91% achieved a SVR, so it is important to achieve RVR. Almost 67% of GT-1 patients treated achieved

RVR using Hemopurifier during the first days of PR therapy. They received up to three, 6-hour Hemopurifier treatments during the first 3 days of PR therapy. Out of ten patients, eight now have undetectable virus. Of the 6 GT-1 patients, 4 achieved RVR. The company hopes to expand into the US.

Studies in India showed that the therapy reduced viral load in both HIV+ and HCV+ dialysis patients without using antivirals. In vitro studies have shown that Hemopurifier could be used in bioterror or pandemic threats. The company believes it would benefit IFN-based treatment as well as treatment with the new direct-acting anti-virals.

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JOHN PLATER ADVOCATE DIES JUNE 30, 2012 Age 45

John Plater—husband, lawyer, hemophiliac, victim of tainted blood, advocate for compensation—died from complications from his HIV and HCV infections. Thanks to his law studies, John was able to help thousands of victims of tainted blood. Our friend Mike McCarthy, also a hemophiliac and advocate, spoke with the press: "John Plater was a man who was bigger than life and put everyone before himself."

He helped many with the red tape involved in applying for compensation, and spoke for victims with his "booming, powerful voice" in court. John's input was instrumental in ensuring the changes leading to the safer blood system we have today. He held office in Hemophilia Ontario and the Canadian Hemophilia Society. He was a close friend of co-infected lawyer/advocate James Kreppner, hemophiliac, who passed away in 2009, at age 47. These are great losses for our Hep C community.

search revealed more in his locker and pockets, and a test showed opiates in his body. He had been replacing stolen syringes with used ones, filled with dummy liquids, to be used on patients. He was hired at 10 more hospitals because nothing was reported—not to the police, nor to any professional organization. As a result, thousands of people in 8 states are being tested. No nationwide database exists showing violations or disciplinary steps taken against health technicians. This wasn't the first time he was fired for stealing drugs. He was charged in New Hampshire, but claimed someone framed him. In 2010, in Arizona, he was found unconscious and taken to the ER. He tested positive for cocaine and marijuana, but police didn't report it for lack of evidence, so though the Arizona Radiologic Board of Examiners were told, they didn't follow through, and never spoke to the hospital. A few days later, he was hired at Temple University Hospital in Philadelphia. He surrendered his professional license, but many states don't require registration and don't check for transgressions. Kansas issued his last license. They checked his studies, but not his past history. He lied on job applications, denying any misconduct actions, and didn't list many places he worked.

Some states don't license radiology techs. Exeter Hospital says there should be a national registry of all problem workers providing patient care. Hopefully, these problems with the system will be examined and fixed-and let's make that an international registry.

"Kwiatkowski's license in New York is still listed on a state website as active and in good standing."

IFN AFFECTS GROWTH IN CHILDREN

107 children ages 5-18 treated with pegIFNa in the Pediatric Study of Hepatitis C (PEDS-C) have shown significant changes in growth, such as height, weight, body mass index (BMI), and body composition. Most of these changes were reversed when therapy ended, but many did not reach their expected height-for-age score 2 years after the end of treatment. The disease is usually mild in children but some do progress to cirrhosis and liver cancer, so PR treatment is approved for young children, and is more useful when the disease has not progressed. The children were seen for two years more to find out if growth was affected. All began with normal height, weight, BMI, and body composition,

but during treatment, some of the children did not grow as was expected for their age. Height was most affected, even though physical activity and eating habits remained the

WILL YOU GET CIRRHOSIS?

NIH Scientists (National Institutes of Health, USA) have found several factors in HCV+ people that might indicate which patients will progress quickly from infection to cirrhosis or other severe liver disease. Such knowledge could improve treatment, which can be expensive and difficult to tolerate. Any tool that can help predict the speed of progression would be helpful. One of the mysteries of the disease is that some patients show no sign of illness, while others die in less than 10 vears. A weak immune system-from coinfection with HIV, for example-can speed progression of the disease.

These researchers took blood samples from 6 patients who received tainted transfusions in the '70s. Their symptoms were followed for up to 30 years, and ranged from mild symptoms to death. The researchers collected blood samples from the 6 patients over the years and were able to analyze 1876 genetic sequences of the HCV, which they used to discover the evolution of two Hep C genes-E1 and E2. They also studied 39 blood proteins throughout the progression of the disease. They found changes in the blood that appeared even in the early stages of the disease such as the presence of a protein called MCP-1, which appears to correspond to the formation of fibrosis leading to cirrhosis.

The scientists, now aware of what to look for, want to expand their studies among more patients. We should be hearing more...

OLDER PATIENTS BEWARE

There is a risk of severe liver damage in older people who use the common, broadspectrum antibiotics named moxifloxacin and levofloxacin, members of the "fluoroquinolone" family of antibiotics, which are prescribed often for bacterial infections of the respiratory tract. Researchers in Toronto and Hamilton studied the risk of taking moxifloxacin compared to

other common antibiotics by looking at past data over 9 years. They sought people 66 years old or over with no previous liver damage who were hospitalized due to liver injury 30 days or less after being prescribed the above antibiotics. 144 patients fit this description. Most suffered liver damage about 9 days after starting the antibiotics. Unfortunately 88 of those patients died during their hospitalization. It was found that moxifloxacin was twice as likely to injure the liver compared to clarithromycin. Levofloxacin was less risky, but still toxic to the liver. Luckily these cases are rare and only occur in about 6 out of 100,000 patients treated.

"Although our results require confirmation in other settings, the findings suggest that both moxifloxacin and levofloxacin be considered for regulatory warnings regarding acute liver injury," stated the authors.

FOOD & SUPPLEMENT NEWS

BODYBUILDING? DIETING? READ THIS

[Note: These are preliminary results released at a conference. They have not yet been confirmed.]

Bodybuilding and weight loss supplements may help you look better, and may help get rid of fatty liver and combat muscle wasting, but some can cause liver damage. Researchers found that 18% of liver injuries reported in a national registry between 2003 and 2011 may have been caused by drugs or supplements. 34% of those were blamed on bodybuild-

ing supplements, and 26%, on dieting supplements.

There are many worthwhile supplements, like multivitamins, calcium, vitamin D, produced by approved companies, and

around 40% of Americans take them. The supplements are sold without a prescription, are not carefully monitored, and there is little info about their side effects. There is a registry for those who have liver damage within 6 months of using some alternative medicines, called

the Drug-Induced Liver Injury Network (DILIN).

Jaundice (yellowing of eyes and skin) from bodybuilding supplements were reported only by men, and caused itching and bright yellow skin that lasted sometimes for over a month. More than 50% were hospitalized. Weight loss supplements were suspected of causing even more damage, including liver inflammation that required liver transplants in 12% of the 17 who reported problems with weight loss products. In 40-50% of these cases, the people were taking no other medication. Some other suspect supplements were products for colds and coughs, depression, anxiety and immune system boosters.

Talk to your doctor before taking any supplements!! It is probably wise to monitor your liver enzymes. Read the labels and check out EVERY ingredient. Steroids may have been added to some bodybuilding supplements. Other supplements may be "spiked."

EAT YOUR APPLE PEELS

The waxy material in apple peels, ursolic acid, increased "brown fat" and muscle in mice that ate high-fat diets in this trial. They burned more calories and had lower obesity rates, and fewer cases of fatty liver and prediabetes than those who didn't take the supplement. Researchers hope this will hold true for humans. Just recently scientist thought only infants had brown fat, but better scanning techniques have shown some brown fat mostly in the neck and between the shoulder blades, in adults, too. Less is found in the obese. Higher amounts are found in those with healthy blood sugar and lipid levels, and may prevent obesity, fatty liver and diabetes, as happened in the mice. Ursolic acid may provide effective therapy for muscle wasting, common in advanced liver disease.

HEP C 101 FOR BABY BOOMERS

Sometimes baby boomers are not diagnosed with hepatitis C because the symptoms are similar to what we tend to expect from the aging process. For instance, tiredness, achy joints, sleep problems, stomach and digestive problems, strange rashes, memory loss, are also symptoms experienced by those with hepatitis C.

Who is at risk?

- ◆Those who received blood transfusions or blood products before 1990;
- ◆Those who have shared blood injecting equipment for drugs;
- ◆Those who have been tattooed, had body piercing or a needlestick injury.
- ♦ Those exposed to mass inoculations such as people serving in the armed forces (veterans have a high infection rate).
- ◆Those coming from places where people share home-injection equipment for antibiotics or other prescription drugs, or where sterilization procedures are not effective.

How is it diagnosed?

Diagnosis is made through a simple blood test.

I've Been Diagnosed. Now What?

If you are diagnosed with hepatitis C, get informed. Check with your doctor and local support group.

Make sure that you:

- ◆Get re-tested to confirm the diagnosis. Ask to see a specialist, such as a hepatologist (liver), gastroenterologist (stomach & intestines), hematologist (blood), or infectious disease specialist.
- ♦ Get vaccinated against hepatitis A and B, and get tested by your family doctor or at the health clinic to see if the vaccinations took.
- ◆ Ask about the pneumonia and flu vaccines. Hepatitis C compromises the immune system and people can get even sicker with flu or pneumonia than a normal person does.
- ◆ Ask that the following tests be done: Ultrasound yearly; alpha-fetoprotein test yearly to check for cancer; liver biopsy (a biopsy is often being replaced with a fibroscan, where available).
- ♦ Ask the doctor for copies of all tests, and get the results explained to you.



PEGCARE

PegCARE is a reimbursement program to help people who have been prescribed Pegetron and need assistance with any copayment they might have, whether through their provincial coverage (i.e., Pharmacare) deductible or their 3rd-party health insurance. It is pro-rated, so the less the family income is, the more help they get. If someone's net family income is less than \$30,000, they will get 100% reimbursement. The income maximum is \$100,000. Patients must be signed up for Fair Pharmacare to qualify, and they need to provide a copy of last year's T4 form.

A 24/7 Nursing Hotline and bilingual assistance is available, at no charge. Other services are access to live translation services (150 languages) and injection assistance from registered nurses. Ask your doctor or nurse to enroll you in PegCARE. It's an easy single-page form to fill out, which they will provide. PegCARE: 1-866-872-5773

PEGASSIST

The PegAssist Reimbursement Assistance Program provides reimbursement coordination assistance for patients who have been prescribed Pegasys or Pegasys RBV. The program will assist in securing funding for patients to ensure that they can start, stay on, and complete their treatment successfully. PegAssist Reimbursement Specialists are available (Monday to Friday, 10 AM - 6 PM EST) by calling: 1-877-PEGASYS or 1-877 -734-2797. Patients can also obtain a program enrollment form from their nurse/ physician to gain access to the program.

The program provides financial aid to qualified patients, alleviating financial barriers which may prevent patients from starting RCMP Blood Probe Task Force TIPS Hotline treatment, i.e., deductibles and/or copayments. In partnership with CALEA Pharmacy, the program can conveniently deliver the medication directly to patients' homes or to the clinics.

NEUPOGEN VICTORY PROGRAM
